Vision

A connected community that empowers older adults to live well.

Mission

We enrich the lives of older adults and engage them in the community by providing affordable and assisted, volunteer-based transportation.

Values

- Reliability: We do what we say we will do. You can count on us.
- Connections: We foster caring relationships between members and drivers as we keep members engaged in the community.
- Equity: We strive to represent our community as we recruit staff, leaders, volunteers and members. We are committed to equitable access, adapting how we work to meet the unique needs of our members.
- Neighborly care: We treat our members, volunteers, and each other with respect and care.
- Stewardship: We take great care to cultivate and manage our time, talent, relationships, and resources well, on behalf of the community.

Access to transportation is one of the biggest unmet needs among older adults

SRN provides transportation to older adults with the help of volunteer and paid drivers who take program members to and from medical appointments, grocery stores, beauty/barber shops, and other destinations.

SRN transportation is available to people 60 and older who are able to safely transfer in and out of a vehicle with limited assistance, have the cognitive capacity to safely use our program, and reside in one of the following areas: West Nashville, Madison, Donelson, Old Hickory, Hermitage, and East Nashville. SRN is currently planning for expansion to reach more of Nashville's older adults.

Riders pay a \$25 annual membership fee and \$6 per round-trip ride. Rider fees cover a small percentage of the total cost to operate the ride program. SRN fundraises for the remainder through foundation and government support and contributions from the community.

Volunteer drivers are critical to our daily success and ability to expand SRN programming into new areas. Driving with SRN is a unique opportunity because volunteers can view our ride calendar and self-select the times they want based on their availability. Volunteer drivers must have 5 years of driving experience, complete orientation and training, provide proof of a valid driver's license and vehicle insurance, have use of a vehicle, and successfully complete driving and criminal background checks. 

In March of 2020, SRN made programmatic changes to help our riders through a time of unprecedented isolation and limited access to necessities. Through partnerships with local organizations, SRN provided cleaning supply delivery, resource guidance, and groceries for those dealing with food insecurity.

In response to the pandemic, SRN also created the Friendly Neighbor Program (FNP). The FNP paired SRN riders with volunteers who called them each week in an effort to reduce isolation. FNP volunteers also provided errand support and distanced visits. The FNP operated from August 2020 through May 2021, when vaccines were widely available and most programs for seniors had reopened.

SRN was proud to be selected as a 2021 finalist for the Center for Nonprofit Management's Salute To Excellence Awards in The Frist Foundation Innovation in Action category for our work through the Friendly Neighbor Program.
